MED-PROJECT APPROVED TO LAUNCH STATEWIDE PROGRAM TO PROVIDE SAFE MEDICATION DISPOSAL TO NEW YORK RESIDENTS

State of New York – The Medication Education & Disposal Project (MED-Project) today announced its approval from the New York Department of Health to provide a free, statewide program and public education campaign to help New York residents dispose of medicine safely and conveniently. MED-Project is supported by the Pharmaceutical Product Stewardship Work Group, a non-profit trade association of pharmaceutical companies.

"We want to encourage residents to take their medication as prescribed, store it securely, and to safely dispose of unwanted or expired medicine," said Dr. Victoria Travis, MED-Project's National Program Director. "MED-Project's dropbox locations and mail-back services make drug disposal easy, convenient, and safe."

When operational, MED-Project will provide safe and free disposal options statewide to ensure residents have equitable access. These include neighborhood pharmacies, medical facilities, law enforcement offices, and other community-based organizations.
