Proposal to Operate a New York State Drug Take Back Program

INTRODUCTION

Pursuant to Chapter 120 Laws of 2018, the New York State Drug Take Back Act (DTB) mandates that manufacturers of covered drugs establish, fund, and operate a New York State approved drug take back program for the safe collection and disposal of unused covered drugs. Any manufacturer or drug take back organization seeking to operate a drug take back program should use this form to submit a proposal to the Department of Health (DOH).

A proposed drug take back program shall be approved if it complies with Drug Take Back Regulations at 10 NYCRR §60-4, and includes the following:

- 1. contact information for the person submitting the planned drug take back program;
- 2. a certification that all covered drugs will be accepted regardless of who produced them;
- 3. details of a collection system to provide convenient, ongoing collection services to all persons seeking to dispose of covered drugs;
- 4. a description of other collection methods by authorized collectors;
- 5. an explanation of how covered drugs will be safely and securely tracked and handled from collection through final disposal and destruction;
- 6. a description of the public education and outreach activities that will be undertaken as part of the program;
- 7. details of how the costs of the pharmacy collection and other authorized collectors will be reimbursed by the manufacturer(s); and
- 8. further information deemed appropriate by DOH.

Approved drug take back programs must be updated at least every three years and submitted to DOH.

Please complete all sections of this proposal and submit along with any supporting attachments to the New York State Department of Health, Bureau of Narcotic Enforcement, by e-mail to dtb@health.ny.gov. Incomplete submissions will not be processed.

II. CERTIFICATION

 \boxtimes Pursuant to 10 NYCRR §60-4.3(b)(2), I certify that this proposed drug take back program will accept all covered drugs, regardless of who produced them.

III. COLLECTION SYSTEM

This section must detail a collection system to provide convenient, ongoing collection services to all persons seeking to dispose of covered drugs pursuant to Public Health Law §292 of Article 2-B and Drug Take Back Regulations at10 NYCRR §60-4, that is geographically distributed in a way to ensure access in rural and underserved areas.

Pursuant to 10 NYCRR §60-4.3(b)(3-6) and (17), provide a detailed description of the proposed drug take back collection system that shall include the following:

- a list of participating pharmacies and other authorized collectors, their DEA number, and their Education Department registration number (if applicable), their locations, and methods of collection, including collection receptacles, mail back programs, and other approved collection methods; and
- how authorized collectors that are currently providing collection receptacles will be included in the program.

MED-Project will provide Reasonable Access to Residents.² "Reasonable Access" means:

- Fulfillment of the Collection Site³-to-resident ratios established at 10 NYCRR 60-4.2(a) for cities and certain counties with a population of 125,000 or more;
- Even distribution of the Collection Sites in those cities and counties with regard to geography and population density, as required under 10 NYCRR 60-4.2(b);
- Geographic distribution of Collection Sites in a way to ensure access in rural and underserved areas, as required under PHL § 291(2)(C) and 10 NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(3). (See Plan section III.B.)

III.A. Geographic Distribution in Cities and Certain Counties with a Population of 125,000 or More [PHL § 292(2), 10 NYCRR

60-4.2(a) - 60-4.2(b), 60-4.3(b)(3)]

To meet the requirement for geographic distribution in 10 NYCRR 60-4.2(b), MED-Project will distribute collection receptacles geographically so that at least 90% of Residents in each of the cities and counties identified at 10 NYCRR 60-4.2(a) live within a specified distance of a Collection Site based on the population density of the city or county:

- Within two miles of a Collection Site where the population density is less than 25,000 residents per square mile.
- Within one mile of a Collection Site where the population density is greater than or equal to 25,000 residents per square mile.

The evaluation of Reasonable Access will account for Collection Sites hosting MED-Project Kiosks⁴ or MED-Project Reimbursed Kiosks.⁵

MED-Project notified Pharmacies and other potential Authorized Collectors in the State⁶ of the opportunity to participate in the Program⁷ as Collection Sites. Pharmacies may choose to participate as a Collection Site in MED-Project's Program or may instead choose to meet their obligations under PHL § 292(1) by offering mail-back collection or offering collection through another method of collection approved by the federal Drug Enforcement Agency. MED-Project will conduct outreach annually to Pharmacies and other potential Authorized Collectors in the State to expand the existing collection system. Table 1 provides more information about the distribution of Collection Sites in each of the cities and counties identified at 10 NYCRR 60-4.2(a).

III.B. Access in Rural and Underserved Areas [PHL § 291(2)(c), 10

NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(3)]

For rural and underserved areas not covered by 10 NYCRR 60-4.2(a), MED-Project will provide Reasonable Access by establishing a Collection Site for every 15,000 Residents of a Rural County.⁸

Table 2 provides a list of Rural Counties in the State and the population of each Rural County.

MED-Project will update the populations using the most current US Census population data as it is available.

Section III.C describes how MED-Project will provide Mail-Back Services⁹ to all Residents, including in rural and underserved areas.

III.C. Convenience for all Consumers across the State [PHL §

291(2)(c), 10 NYCRR 60-4.2(c)(1) - 60-4.2(c)(2), 60-4.3(b)(3)]

MED-Project has designed its collection system to provide Reasonable Access to all Residents in the State while also providing for Program cost efficiency. See PHL § 292.4. In addition to the network of Collection Sites, MED-Project will offer Residents Mail-Back Packages¹⁰ for Covered Drugs through the Call Center¹¹ and Website, ¹² which are also available in rural and underserved areas. MED-Project will offer any Pharmacy that does not host a MED-Project Kiosk or MED-Project Reimbursed Kiosk, including nonresident Pharmacies, Vouchers¹³ for Mail-Back Packages that direct Residents to information on drug take back and safe drug disposal methods. <u>Appendix B</u> provides a sample image of a Voucher.

If Reasonable Access is no longer achieved because a Collection Site permanently closes, relocates, or discontinues its maintenance of a collection receptacle, MED-Project will work to expand its network of Collection Sites to achieve Reasonable Access within 90 days.

MED-Project will implement the Program to rely on Collection Sites as the primary collection service for providing Reasonable Access across the State. To do this, MED-Project will establish Collection Sites to meet the Reasonable Access metrics specified in Plan sections III.A and III.B. MED-Project will establish Collection Sites to achieve Reasonable Access by 360 days after plan approval.

In addition to offering Residents Mail-Back Packages for Covered Drugs through the Call Center and Website, MED-Project will establish a Mail-Back Distribution Location¹⁴ or hold at least one annual Drug Take-Back Event¹⁵ in place of each Collection Site still needed in areas where Reasonable Access has not

been achieved. MED-Project will establish a Mail-Back Distribution Location in place of each Collection Site still needed to achieve Reasonable Access within 360 days of Plan approval.

Beginning 360 days after Plan approval and annually thereafter, MED-Project will schedule Drug Take-Back Events in areas where there are not enough Collection Sites or Mail-Back Distribution Locations to achieve Reasonable Access. MED-Project will then hold Drug Take-Back Event(s) in these areas within 180 days.

MED-Project will notify Pharmacies and other potential Authorized Collectors in the State of the opportunity to serve as a Collection Site annually. Once MED-Project achieves Reasonable Access through established Collection Sites, Drug Take-Back Events will be discontinued except where Drug Take-Back Events are requested as described in section IV.A. Mail-Back Services will be available to Residents through the Website and Call Center regardless of the number of Collection Sites established.

MED-Project will notify the Pharmacies and other potential Authorized Collectors of the opportunity to participate in MED-Project's program at least twice a year in any Rural Counties with fewer than one Collection Site per 15,000 Residents.

If DOH approves another drug take-back program that establishes a different standard for coverage in place of missing Collection Sites, MED-Project may adopt that standard by submitting a written notice to DOH.

III.D. Ongoing Services of the Program [10 NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(3)]

III.D.1. MED-Project Kiosks [PHL § 292(1)(a)(i)]

As described in section III.A, MED-Project notified Pharmacies and other potential Authorized Collectors in the State of the opportunity to participate in the Program as Collection Sites. MED-Project will conduct outreach to Pharmacies and other potential Authorized Collectors annually consistent with the outreach efforts described in sections III.C and III.E. MED-Project will offer a MED-Project Kiosk to any Pharmacy or other potential Authorized Collector in the State wishing to participate in the Program voluntarily that executes an agreement with MED-Project and is able to follow all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements. In addition to offering a MED-Project Kiosk to such sites, MED-Project will offer to work with sites hosting existing collection receptacles to approve those collection receptacles for inclusion as a MED-Project Kiosk in the Program if possible.

MED-Project will offer more than one size of MED-Project Kiosk to Pharmacies and other potential Authorized Collectors to accommodate limited floor space availability.

Vendor¹⁶ will only service collection receptacles that meet Vendor's service specifications, i.e., the collection receptacle is the same dimensions as Vendor's standard collection receptacle model(s) or Vendor's inner liner and box(es) are compatible with the existing collection receptacle. Reasons Vendor will not service an existing collection receptacle include, but are not limited to:

- The collection receptacle's construction or placement do not comply with applicable laws, regulations, or other legal requirements.
- The collection receptacle is not compatible with Vendor's inner liner and box.
- The Authorized Collector does not own the collection receptacle or have the rights for it to be serviced by Vendor.
- The Authorized Collector has not signed an agreement with MED-Project.

 $^{^{16}}$ "Vendor" is any vendor listed in the Vendor table in <u>Appendix D</u> and hired by MED-Project to provide goods or services under the Program.

When Vendor will not service existing collection receptacle, MED-Project will convert existing collection receptacles to MED-Project Kiosks by replacing the existing collection receptacle with a collection receptacle provided by MED-Project or by reimbursing the collection receptacle host for continued operation of the existing collection receptacle up until the point that the collection receptacle becomes a MED-Project Kiosk, subject to terms and conditions laid out by MED-Project.

A Pharmacy or other potential Authorized Collector hosting a collection receptacle as part of the New York Department of Environmental Conservation program can participate in the Program voluntarily. Existing collection receptacles in the New York Department of Environmental Conservation program are compatible with Vendor's inner liner and box.

Pre-filled Injector Products¹⁷ cannot be commingled with other Covered Drugs in MED-Project Kiosks and will be collected in Injector Mail-Back Packages.¹⁸ All MED-Project Kiosks will have signage showing that they are part of the Program, explaining information about the Program, explaining what is accepted and not accepted in the MED-Project Kiosk, and explaining how to order Injector Mail-Back Packages. For further discussion of signage and other materials that will be provided with MED-Project Kiosks, see section VI.A.4.

All MED-Project Kiosks must be securely placed and maintained inside a Collection Site's registered location, LEA's¹⁹ physical location, or at an authorized long-term care facility. MED-Project Kiosks, as well as inner liners and containers, must meet federal and state law specifications, including those identified in Table 3. Table 3 provides a summary of activities related to installing and operating a MED-Project Kiosk, as well as the relevant regulatory references. <u>Appendix C</u> provides sample mockups of MED-Project Kiosks and signage.

Because MED-Project does not collect or dispose of Covered Drugs itself, the requirements in Table 3 apply to Vendors and Authorized Collectors. For a discussion of how MED-Project provides for Program compliance with all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements, including the requirements in Table 3, see section V.

III.D.2. MED-Project Reimbursed Kiosks [PHL §§ 291(2)(g), 292(1)(a)(i)]

MED-Project will offer reimbursement for the costs of collection incurred by Authorized Collectors that host a collection receptacle for the collection of Covered Drugs. To receive reimbursement, Authorized Collectors must sign a reimbursement agreement that certifies the Authorized Collector will:

- Follow all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements, including those in Table 3, in the collection of Covered Drugs.
- Document collection costs incurred by the Authorized Collector.
- Negotiate in good faith to host a MED-Project Kiosk following Plan approval or once any existing collection receptacle service agreements have concluded.

MED-Project will reimburse Authorized Collectors until they can convert their collection receptacle to a MED-Project Kiosk. Reimbursement will be retroactive to the effective date of the New York State Drug Take Back Act. Alternatively, if an existing collection receptacle cannot be serviced by Vendor, MED-Project will reimburse the collection receptacle host for collection costs until the point that the collection receptacle becomes a MED-Project Kiosk, subject to terms and conditions laid out by MED-Project. Once a collection receptacle host and MED-Project have agreed that the collection receptacle will be serviced by Vendor or replaced by a collection receptacle provided by MED-Project, the collection receptacle will become a MED-Project Kiosk.

III.D.3. Mail-Back Services and Vouchers [PHL §§ 292(1)(a)(ii), 292(5), 10 NYCRR 60-

4.6(a) - 60-4.6(c)]

MED-Project will offer three types of Mail-Back Packages through the MED-Project Call Center and Website:

- Standard Mail-Back Packages²⁰ for Covered Drugs that are not Pre-filled Injector Products or inhalers.
- Injector Mail-Back Packages for Pre-filled Injector Products.
- Inhaler Mail-Back Packages²¹ for inhalers.

MED-Project will offer Vouchers to any Pharmacy not hosting a collection receptacle, including all nonresident Pharmacies registered per § 6808-b of the New York Education Law that provide Covered Drugs to Residents by mail. MED-Project will also offer Vouchers to retail pharmacies that are not "Pharmacies" as defined by PHL § 292.4 so long as they are open to the public. To receive and distribute Vouchers from MED-Project, a pharmacy must execute an agreement with MED-Project to become a Voucher Site²² and meet certain requirements, including making the Vouchers available to Residents and in accordance with the terms of the DTB, Regulations²³, or the Plan.

Each Voucher will include MED-Project's Website address and Call Center phone number, both of which provide Residents information on drug take-back and safe drug disposal methods and allow Residents to order a prepaid Mail-Back Package. <u>Appendix B</u> provides a sample image of a Voucher. MED-Project will also offer Vouchers in other formats (e.g., on a receipt printed out by the pharmacy) in place of, or along with, a hardcopy Voucher.

Mail-Back Packages will be pre-paid and pre-addressed, and Mail-Back Services shall comply with all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements. All Mail-Back Packages will provide:

- Instructions for using the Mail-Back Package.
- A description of the types of Covered Drugs that are accepted in the Mail-Back Package.
- Mailing restrictions and a notice that only packages provided by Vendor will be accepted for destruction.
- Instructions for returning the Mail-Back Package.

Pre-filled Injector Products are not commingled with other Covered Drugs in Standard Mail-Back Packages or Inhaler Mail-Back Packages and will be collected in Injector Mail-Back Packages. Inhalers will be collected in Inhaler Mail-Back Packages.

As described in section III.C, MED-Project will prioritize establishing Mail-Back Distribution Locations where there are not enough Collection Sites to provide Reasonable Access. Mail-Back Distribution Locations will be in staffed facilities that are open to the public.

Mail-Back Distribution Locations will be offered signage indicating that the site offers Mail-Back Packages, and written materials with more information about Program offerings. MED-Project will provide Standard Mail-Back Packages, Inhaler Mail-Back Packages, and Injector Mail-Back Packages as requested by Mail-Back Distribution Locations. MED-Project's Help Desk²⁴ will allow Mail-Back Distribution Locations to request Mail-Back Packages in bulk as needed to maintain stock.

III.E. Inclusion of Pharmacies Providing Collection Boxes in Areas Outside of the Counties with Convenience Standards [10 NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(4)]

As described in section III.A, MED-Project notified Pharmacies providing collection receptacles in areas outside of the counties with convenience standards of the opportunity to participate in the Program. MED-Project will continue to reach out annually to Pharmacies providing collection receptacles in areas outside of the counties with convenience standards.

MED-Project will work with Pharmacies providing collection receptacles in areas outside of the counties with convenience standards to execute an agreement to become a Collection Site once the Pharmacy expresses interest in participating in the Program. Sections III.D.1 and III.D.2 provide additional information about participating in the Program as a Collection Site.

III.F. Reverse Distributors [10 NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(5)]

<u>Appendix D</u> includes the name, address, phone, e-mail address, DEA number, and Bureau of Narcotic Enforcement license number for Reverse Distributors used by the Program. MED-Project will use permitted waste disposal facilities meeting federal requirements such as those listed in the treatment and disposal facility table in <u>Appendix D</u>.

III.G. Participating Pharmacies and other Authorized Collectors [10 NYCRR 60-4.2(c)(1) - 60-4.2(c)(3), 60-4.3(b)(6), 60-4.3(e)]

<u>Appendix E</u> includes a list of participating Pharmacies and other Authorized Collectors that have already executed an agreement to participate as a Collection Site. The appendix includes the applicable DEA number, Education Department registration number, location, and method(s) of collection offered by each Collection Site. MED-Project will continue to execute agreements with Pharmacies and other potential Authorized Collectors as they offer to participate as Collection Sites and agree to follow all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements.

Changes to Collection Sites will be provided to DOH in accordance with the change management approach provided in <u>Appendix A</u>.

III.H. Inclusion of Authorized Collectors Providing Collection Receptacles [10 NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(17)]

MED-Project will include Authorized Collectors providing collection receptacles through the process described in sections III.D.1 and III.D.2.

III.I. Joint Collection Services Coordination

MED-Project does not contemplate providing joint collection services with another Operator at this time and does not describe how Operators would coordinate resources to meet convenience standard requirements. Regardless of whether Operators provide services jointly or separately, each Operator is responsible for meeting the DTB's requirements and cannot delegate that responsibility to another Operator. Should MED-Project agree to coordinate services with another Operator, MED-Project will seek approval from DOH for changes to the Plan as outlined in <u>Appendix A</u> and, upon request, will provide DOH any information about such an agreement.

IV. OTHER COLLECTION METHODS

Pursuant to 10 NYCRR §60-4.3(b)(7), use this section to describe other approved collection methods, including drug take back events, that the proposed program will use to collect covered drugs.

IV.A. Other Collection Methods [PHL §§ 292(1)(a)(iii), 291(2)(d), 10 NYCRR

60-4.3(b)(7)]

As described in section III.C, MED-Project will schedule Drug Take-Back Events, excluding the National Prescription Drug Take Back Day, where there are not enough Collection Sites or Mail-Back Distribution Locations to provide Reasonable Access. MED-Project will begin scheduling Drug Take-Back Events 360 days after Plan approval. MED-Project will contract with LEAs to oversee Drug Take-Back Events. These contracts will provide for the collection, transportation, and disposal of Covered Drugs and include requirements for participating LEAs. Scheduling of Drug Take-Back Events requires coordination with participating LEAs.

MED-Project will provide local health officials a summary of collection services offered in their counties and services available under the Program annually. If requested by local health officials in a county where there are enough Collection Sites or Mail-Back Distribution Locations to provide Reasonable Access, MED-Project will work with LEAs to schedule up to two Collection Events in a county per year.

Vendor will work in coordination with MED-Project and LEAs to implement procedures to collect Covered Drugs in compliance with all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements. Any material that is not a Covered Drug or does not meet legal requirements will not be accepted.

Covered Drugs will be packaged in inner liners, matched to the unique inner liner identifiers on the shipping labels, and the inner liners prepared for shipment in compliance with all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements. Collected material will be weighed following the completion of each Drug Take-Back Event. LEAs will maintain control and custody of the packaged inner liner to the point of secure transfer, storage, or destruction.

V. HANDLING, COLLECTION, AND DISPOSAL OF COVERED DRUGS

This section must explain how covered drugs will be safely and securely tracked and handled from collection through final disposal and destruction, policies to ensure security and compliance with all applicable laws and regulations including disposal and destruction at a permitted waste disposal facility meeting federal requirements.

Pursuant to 10 NYCRR §60-4.3(b)(8), provide detailed policies and procedures on how the proposed drug take back program will safely and securely track and handle collection of covered drugs through final disposal and destruction, which includes information on policies to ensure security and compliance with all applicable laws and regulations including disposal and destruction at a permitted waste disposal facility that meets federal requirements.

V.A. Agreements with Entities Participating in the Program

[10 NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(8), 60-4.4(a) - 60-4.5(e)]

MED-Project provides for Program compliance with all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements by: (1) requiring compliance for participating entities; (2) supporting such compliance as needed; and (3) monitoring Program operations. More detail on MED-Project's compliance program follows below. In brief:

- MED-Project requires participating entities to follow all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements through agreements with Vendors, Authorized Collectors, Voucher Sites, Mail-Back Distribution Locations, and LEAs. See Plan Section V.A.
- MED-Project supports participating entity compliance, including by providing guidance to Collection Sites to self-assess their records and MED-Project Kiosk and by providing ongoing support through the Help Desk. See Plan Sections V.B, and V.C
- 3. MED-Project monitors Program operations, including through reporting, inspections, and audits. *See* Plan Section V.B.

Because MED-Project does not collect or dispose of Covered Drugs itself, laws and regulations addressing the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs apply to Vendors and Authorized Collectors. Nevertheless, to provide for MED-Project's compliance with applicable requirements, MED-Project has policies and procedures for maintaining its internal records and uses an incident management system to address potential safety and security issues. *See* Plan Sections V.G, VIII.B.

MED-Project requires all entities participating in the Program to follow all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements, including, but not limited to, the laws and regulations listed in Tables 3 and 4.

MED-Project will enter into agreements with Vendors involved in the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs under the Program. MED-Project agreements require that Collection Sites and Vendors involved in the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs maintain policies and procedures covering safety, security, and compliance with all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements. These policies and procedures shall be followed by persons handling Covered Drugs collected under the Program. Below is a summary of the elements of those agreements to demonstrate how MED-Project maintains the required policies and procedures.

MED-Project contracts with Vendors typically require that Vendor:

- If applicable, provide collection receptacles meeting all federal and state requirements.
- Follow all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements.
- Maintain all professional and governmental permits, licenses, consents, authorizations and certifications required by applicable laws for the performance of Program services.
- Provide Program services in a timely, professional, and commercially diligent manner according to generally accepted industry and professional standards.
- Provide confirmation that employee trainings are complete.
- Comply with industry-standard safety and security procedures.

- Notify MED-Project of any action, suit, or proceeding before or by any court or governmental authority that could materially affect Vendor ability to provide Program services.
- Obtain written pre-approval before changing disposal facilities.
- Use commercially reasonable measures to prevent theft or diversion of Covered Drugs.
- Report safety, security, or other procedural deviations.
- Maintain comprehensive information security programs and notify MED-Project in the event of a data breach.
- Maintain complete and accurate records, such as books, documents, and accounting procedures, and practices. The contract allows MED-Project to audit such records.
- Provide written reports related to Program services.

Agreements with Authorized Collectors hosting MED-Project Kiosks typically require that the Authorized Collector:

- Comply with all applicable laws regarding the collection, handling, processing, and disposal of Covered Drugs.
- Possess all required authorizations to enter into an agreement for Program services.
- Identify a responsible manager and provide qualified staff.
- Have qualified staff present for unlocking and locking the MED-Project Kiosk.
- Complete documentation under all applicable laws for collection receptacle delivery, installation, or removal, and Covered Drug collection, storage, transportation, or disposal.
- Maintain any documentation required under the Program and provide such documentation to MED-Project upon request.
- Make the MED-Project Kiosk available to Residents during business hours unless there is a safety, security, service, maintenance, or other condition requiring the Collection Site to lock the MED-Project Kiosk.
- Promptly notify MED-Project of any service or maintenance concerns.
- Collect and store Covered Drugs and cause the transportation and disposal of Covered Drugs.
- Establish and implement procedures limiting access to MED-Project Kiosk keys to qualified staff.
- Lock the MED-Project Kiosk and cooperate with MED-Project for MED-Project Kiosk removal upon termination of the agreement.
- Report any theft, unexplained loss, or diversion of Covered Drugs, safety or security problem, or environmental incident.

Agreements with Authorized Collectors hosting MED-Project Reimbursed Kiosks typically require that the Authorized Collector:

- Comply with all applicable laws regarding the collection, handling, processing, and disposal of Covered Drugs.
- Possess all required authorizations to enter into an agreement.
- Make the MED-Project Reimbursed Kiosk available to Residents during business hours unless there is a safety, security, service, maintenance, or other condition requiring the Collection Site to lock the MED-Project Reimbursed Kiosk.
- Document collection costs incurred during the collection, transportation, and disposal of Covered Drugs.
- Securely maintain any documentation required under the Program and provide such documentation to MED-Project upon request.
- Report any theft, unexplained loss, or diversion of Covered Drugs, safety or security problem, or environmental incident.

Agreements with Voucher Sites typically require that the Voucher Site:

- Distribute Vouchers to Residents in compliance with all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements.
- Make Vouchers available to Residents free of charge.
- Request additional Vouchers using MED-Project systems.
- Store Vouchers in a secure area, if applicable.
- Complete documentation required by MED-Project for distributing Vouchers.
- Securely maintain any documentation required under the Program in accordance with applicable laws and provide such documentation to MED-Project upon request.

Agreements with Mail-Back Distribution Locations typically require that the Mail-Back Distribution Location:

- Distribute Mail-Back Packages to Residents in compliance with all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements.
- Make Mail-Back Packages available to Residents free of charge.
- Request additional Mail-Back Packages according to the process provided in the agreement.
- Dispose of commercial waste by means other than Mail-Back Packages.
- Store Mail-Back Packages in a secure area.
- Store Mail-Back Packages to avoid damage or package compromise.
- Store and distribute Mail-Back Packages without modifying or removing package labels.
- Distribute Mail-Back Packages without collecting personal information from Residents.
- Distribute Mail-Back Packages without handling, collecting, or storing Mail-Back Packages containing Covered Drugs from Residents or shipping Mail-Back Packages on behalf of Residents.
- Complete documentation under all applicable laws and required by MED-Project for distributing Mail-Back Packages.
- Securely maintain any documentation required under the Program and provide such documentation to MED-Project upon request.

Agreements for Drug Take-Back Events typically require that LEAs will:

- Maintain compliance with all applicable laws regarding the collection, handling, processing, and disposal of Covered Drugs.
- Possess all required authorization to enter into an agreement for Program services.
- Collect and store Covered Drugs and cause the transportation and disposal of Covered Drugs.
- Report any theft, unexplained loss, or diversion of Covered Drugs, safety or security problem, or environmental incident.

Note that agreements for Collection Sites located at long-term care facilities may vary from what is described above in order to comply with all applicable laws.

V.B. Handling and Disposal of Covered Drugs [PHL § 291(2)(e), 10 NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(5), 60-4.3(b)(8)

MED-Project will provide for a handling, transport, and disposal system that complies with applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements. Each Mail-Back Package, inner liner, and shipping box provided under the Program will have a unique identifier enabling tracking. MED-Project's Vendors involved in the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs monitor the related tracking data and report to

MED-Project. Appendix D provides the Vendors the Program proposes to use. More information about MED-Project agreements is provided in section V.A.

MED-Project conducts routine reviews of Vendors involved in the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs to address trends and service levels. MED-Project will monitor compliance of Vendors involved in the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs through reporting and audits performed by MED-Project or third parties. For Vendors, these activities will include:

- Review and inspection of weekly and monthly reporting from Vendors involved in collection and disposal of Covered Drugs from collection receptacles.
- MED-Project assessment of reported data, including reconciling reported data with invoices and verifying services provided by Vendors involved in collection and disposal, each month.
- MED-Project review and assessment of independent third party, in-person, and comprehensive facility reviews to assess critical environmental, operational, and financial information relating to disposal facilities.
- In-person audits of Vendors involved in collection and disposal of Covered Drugs when determined necessary or appropriate, for example, if the Vendor has reported safety, security, or other procedural deviations which require follow-up.

For Authorized Collectors hosting MED-Project Kiosks, these activities will include:

- Training Collection Sites to regularly self-assess their records and MED-Project Kiosk.
- Inspection of the MED-Project Kiosk by the Service Technician²⁵ helping to prepare inner liners for Carrier²⁶ pick-up as part of the Scheduled Collection Service.²⁷ See section V.B.1.
- Regular inspections by MED-Project of each MED-Project Kiosk, including a review of the required documentation and record-keeping.

These activities are designed to evaluate current logistics practices associated with services provided to confirm they are sufficient to meet Collection Sites' needs and to enhance secure pick-up and transportation of Covered Drugs from collection receptacles to reverse distributor receiving sites.

MED-Project Kiosk Service [PHL § 291(2)(e), 10 NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(8)] **V.B.1.**

MED-Project will enter into agreements with all relevant entities participating in the Program before establishing Collection Sites. Agreements with Authorized Collectors hosting a MED-Project Kiosk and Vendors involved in the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs require that all persons handling or disposing of Covered Drugs report any safety and security problems to MED-Project. Agreements also require handling and disposal of Covered Drugs that is safe, secure, and compliant with all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements.

²⁵ "Service Technicians" are personnel, provided by Vendor, trained to help prepare inner liners for shipment and disposal under the supervision of the Collection Site.

²⁶ "Carrier" is a common or contract carrier used to transport Covered Drugs.

²⁷ "Scheduled Collection Service" is a service method whereby MED-Project provides for a Service Technician to help prepare MED-Project Kiosk inner liners provided by Vendor for Carrier pick-up.

MED-Project offers two types of collection service method: Scheduled Collection Service and On-Demand Collection Service.²⁸ For both methods, MED-Project provides for the collection, transportation, and disposal of Covered Drugs at no cost to the Collection Site.

At a Collection Site participating via the On-Demand Collection Service method, the Collection Site employees shall prepare the inner liner for shipment. This collection method will enable Collection Sites to control the timing for servicing the MED-Project Kiosk when it is full and avoid disruptions to operations from scheduled third-party technician visits or inner liner storage limitations. Because Collection Sites have this control, they can minimize storage time by packaging inner liners immediately before pick-up by Carrier.

At a Collection Site participating via the Scheduled Collection Service method, MED-Project will provide for a Service Technician to help prepare MED-Project Kiosk inner liners for pick-up by Carrier and replace the packaged inner liners with replenishment inner liners on a predetermined schedule. Carrier will pick up packaged inner liners from Collection Sites that participate via the Scheduled Collection Service method according to a regular cadence based on a Collection Site's business hours and volume collected.

When servicing a MED-Project Kiosk, Collection Site employees following instructions provided by Vendor (On-Demand Collection Service method) or Service Technician(s) under the supervision of the Collection Site (Scheduled Collection Service method) will:

- Check the MED-Project Kiosk for any damage.
- Remove the inner liner and box from the MED-Project Kiosk.
- Seal the inner liner at once following procedures meeting all DEA and State requirements.
- Replace the removed inner liner and box with a replenishment inner liner and box provided by Vendor.
- Match the unique identifier of the inner liner to the tracking number on the shipping label.
- Package the inner liner for transport.
- Prepare the packaged inner liner for shipment and perform applicable pre-transportation functions following the DOT Hazardous Materials Regulations ("HMR") and Vendor shipping requirements.
- Schedule a pick-up by Carrier.

Under DEA regulations, Collection Site employees will document each phase of the process.

If the package with the sealed inner liner is prepared before Carrier pick-up, the Collection Site will store the inner liner in compliance with all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements until Carrier pick-up. MED-Project and the reverse distributor Vendor will monitor the inner liner management activity through Vendor and Carrier's transportation tracking systems. Collection Site staff will monitor the MED-Project Kiosk and store inner liners in accordance with DEA requirements.

²⁸ "On-Demand Collection Service" is a service method whereby Collection Site employees manage the removal and packaging of full MED-Project Kiosk inner liners provided by Vendor for Carrier pick-up.




Figure 1: MED-Project Kiosk Service Process

MED-Project will provide for the routine inspection of MED-Project Kiosks to monitor for general wear and tear and clean the MED-Project Kiosk as necessary to maintain proper function. When servicing a MED-Project Kiosk, Collection Site employees and/or a Service Technician will inspect the MED-Project Kiosk for any needed maintenance. The Collection Site employees and/or Service Technician will submit any maintenance requests through the Help Desk. Maintenance requests meeting the conditions specified in section V.D will receive a Rapid Response.²⁹

Collection Sites participating via the On-Demand Collection Service method will receive an initial supply of inner liners and boxes. Replenishment inner liners and boxes will ship automatically, as needed, when packaged inner liners are picked up by Carrier. Collection Sites participating via the Scheduled Collection Service method will receive a new box and inner liner at or before the time of service by the Service Technician.

MED-Project will provide a system to fulfill orders for additional inner liners and boxes if a Collection Site participating via the On-Demand Collection Service method must lock a MED-Project Kiosk because it is full. Collection Sites will be able to specify a replenishment schedule, including the number of replenishment inner liners and boxes, to prevent inner liner and box depletion.

MED-Project will provide a system to fulfill a request for an additional service if a Collection Site participating via the Scheduled Collection Service method must lock a MED-Project Kiosk because it is full. Collection Sites will be able to specify a service schedule to prevent the MED-Project Kiosk from reaching capacity.

Note that the procedures described in this section may vary for Collection Sites located at long-term care facilities in order to comply with all applicable laws.

V.B.2. Transportation and Receipt of Covered Drugs [PHL § 291(2)(e), 10 NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(5), 60-4.3(b)(8)]

Upon Carrier pick-up, packaged inner liners from Collection Sites hosting a MED-Project Kiosk will be tracked by the Carrier and Vendor tracking systems until they are scanned for receipt at an approved reverse distributor facility. After receipt by the reverse distributor, the packaged inner liner will be stored in accordance with all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements. If applicable, the

reverse distributor will transfer the packaged inner liner to a permitted disposal facility meeting federal requirements.

Returned Mail-Back Packages will be transported by Carrier to an approved facility and handled in compliance with all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements. Each Mail-Back Package will have a unique identifier for tracking. Any management of filled Standard Mail-Back Packages will comply with all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements.

MED-Project's Vendors involved in the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs monitor the related tracking data and report to MED-Project. More information about MED-Project agreements is provided in section V.A.

Appendix D provides the reverse distributor facilities the Program proposes to use.

V.B.3. Disposal of Covered Drugs [PHL § 291(2)(e), 10 NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(5), 60-4.3(b)(8)]

Upon receipt at a reverse distributor facility, Standard Mail-Back Packages, Inhaler Mail-Back Packages, and packaged inner liners will be recorded for receipt verification, weighed, and destroyed at a permitted disposal facility meeting federal requirements.

Upon arriving at a treatment facility, Injector Mail-Back Packages will be recorded for receipt verification, weighed, and then disposed of at a disposal facility.

MED-Project will use permitted waste disposal facilities meeting federal requirements such as those listed in <u>Appendix D</u>.

V.C. Ongoing Support

MED-Project will manage a Help Desk for Collection Sites, Voucher Sites, Mail-Back Distribution Locations, and potential Authorized Collectors to provide the following support functions:

- Answer questions and monitor comments from Collection Sites and potential Authorized Collectors.
- Direct and respond to requests for maintenance or a Rapid Response from Collection Sites.
- Receive expressions of interest in the Program from potential Authorized Collectors.
- Receive and fulfill requests for additional inner liners and boxes or additional services from Collection Sites hosting a MED-Project Kiosk.
- Receive and fulfill requests for additional stock of Vouchers from Voucher Sites.
- Receive and fulfill requests for additional Mail-Back Packages from Mail-Back Distribution Locations.
- Receive and fulfill requests for signage from Collection Sites.
- Receive and fulfill requests for written materials from other interested parties upon request.
- Provide Collection Sites access to instructional materials, including written instructions, downloadable forms, and/or video instruction guides.

V.D. Rapid Response

A major event, such as a flood, earthquake, or fire, jeopardizing the security characteristics of a MED-Project Kiosk or structural integrity of a Collection Sites physical location, may necessitate service at a Collection Site. Such events may require the involvement of law enforcement, fire, or other emergency service personnel. Collection Site employees will be directed to call 911 in situations posing an immediate threat to the environment or health. Once the area is safe for access, Vendor will dispatch rapid responders to secure the MED-Project Kiosk and remove its contents.

Vendor maintains a network of rapid responders that can be contacted in the case of an incident or other event requiring a Rapid Response and is able to respond within three hours in most cases when notified of a requested Rapid Response. Rapid responders will bring all necessary equipment to manage the specific needs of the Collection Site requiring a Rapid Response.

V.E. Protecting Resident Information

Instructions at MED-Project Kiosks will inform Residents that they should completely cross out, remove, or otherwise make unreadable all personally identifiable information on drug containers and packaging before depositing them in the collection receptacle. In cases where people follow the instructions, there will be no personally identifiable information.

In addition to MED-Project Kiosk signage, Program promotional materials will encourage Residents to protect their information by ensuring that identifiable information is not present before depositing drug containers and packaging into MED-Project Kiosks. Examples of MED-Project Kiosk signage and MED-Project webpages are available in <u>Appendices C</u> and <u>H</u>, respectively.

As added protection, the inner liners for the MED-Project Kiosks will be opaque, in compliance with the DEA Rule.³⁰ Mail-Back Packages provided under the Program are also opaque. This will prevent anyone from seeing any information on the Covered Drug containers and packaging collected at Collection Sites or placed in Mail-Back Packages.

MED-Project Kiosk inner liners and Standard Mail-Back Packages cannot be x-rayed, analyzed, or otherwise penetrated under the DEA Rule and Regulations. Collection Sites and Vendors involved in the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs must comply with those requirements under their agreements with MED-Project.

V.F. Tracking Information Provided by Vendors [10 NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(8)]

MED-Project requires its Vendors involved with collection and disposal services to track and analyze certain metrics and data related to the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs collected under the Program. MED-Project requires its Vendors involved with collection and disposal services to report that information to MED-Project at regular periods and upon request. Through these policies, together MED-Project and Vendors involved in the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs safely and securely track Covered Drugs collected under the Program through final disposal and destruction.

Additionally, MED-Project's agreements with its Vendors involved with collection and disposal services require that the Vendors maintain complete and accurate records, such as books, documents, and accounting procedures, and practices. The agreements also allow MED-Project to audit such records.

Pursuant to 10 NYCRR §60-4.3(b)(16), provide detailed information on how the operator will identify and resolve safety and security issues arising from the collection, transportation or disposal of covered drugs.

V.G. Safety and Security [10 NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(8), 60-4.3(b)(16)]

MED-Project has an incident management system that requires evaluation of incidents for potential safety and security issues. MED-Project agreements require Vendors involved in the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs to report safety or security issues. Agreements with Collection Sites also require reporting of any safety or security issues. Whenever a potential safety or security issue is reported, MED-Project and/or Vendor undertake a root cause analysis to identify and implement corrective and preventative actions to resolve the issue. MED-Project's incident management system tracks the corrective and preventative actions to completion.

MED-Project will communicate with Collection Sites to remind them of any obligations they may have to report to DOH or the federal DEA regarding any safety or security issues under 10 NYCRR 60-4.4(f) or 21 CFR 1317.

VI. PUBLIC EDUCATION AND OUTREACH

This section must describe the public education and outreach activities that will be undertaken, which shall include advertising of collection locations on a website and through use of signage and other written materials, and how the program will evaluate the effectiveness of each method.

VI.A. Public Education and Outreach [PHL § 291(2)(f), 10 NYCRR 60-

MED-Project will conduct a comprehensive education and outreach program to promote awareness and participation in the Program. MED-Project's education and outreach program will:

- Promote the Program to Residents by providing Collection Sites signage and educational and outreach materials to distribute to Residents.
- Provide educational and outreach materials to persons authorized to prescribe drugs, Pharmacies, pharmacists, and Residents.
- Provide information on the Program, including disposal options, and receive requests for Mail-Back Packages from Residents through the Website and Call Center.
- Provide additional outreach materials as needed to promote the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs.

MED-Project will promote Program participation to the following target audiences:

- 1. Residents.
- 2. Pharmacies and other potential Authorized Collectors.

The education and outreach program will reach target audiences through a variety of media channels and formats to:

- Inform Residents where, why, and how to dispose of Covered Drugs safely.
- Account for the diverse media consumption habits, behaviors, and motivating factors of Residents across the State.
- Improve message retention.

The education and outreach program will include several elements designed to reach Residents and provide consistent access to timely and relevant information. The following sections describe elements of MED-Project's education and outreach program to Residents.

To provide geographic dispersal of advertising across the State, MED-Project will execute advertising campaigns to promote awareness.

Changes to public education and outreach will be provided to DOH in accordance with the change management approach provided in <u>Appendix A</u>.

VI.A.1. Advertisement [PHL § 291(2)(f), 10 NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(9)]

To promote the Program, MED-Project will conduct a combination of advertisements through a variety of channels. The following paid advertising will be implemented across the State based on pharmaceutical take-back experience and analytics of existing regional programs related to the safe disposal of Covered Drugs including:

- Digital media.
- Targeted advertisement.
- Social media influencers and sponsorships.

Supplemental paid advertising will include:

- Targeted direct mail.
- Targeted print advertising.

More detail on advertisements is provided in the sections below.

VI.A.1.a. Public Service Announcements

The public service announcements will include multiple video, audio, and static media variants highlighting different disposal options. Messaging will target Residents over the age of 18 and include information about the proper and safe disposal of Covered Drugs.

VI.A.1.b. Digital and Online Media

MED-Project will seek to participate in advertisement discounts for non-profit organizations, such as Google Ad Grants or other similar programs. MED-Project will launch a statewide campaign specifically targeting individuals with inquiries related to the disposal of Covered Drugs.

VI.A.1.c. Traditional and Social Media

MED-Project will distribute press releases directly to major media outlets and local media. In addition, MED-Project will provide a template for press releases and emails to partners and local health officials to spread through their own networks, allowing for customized news and announcements with specific details about their jurisdiction, organization, agency, or business.

MED-Project will provide education and outreach by utilizing a variety of methods to perform media campaigns throughout the year. The level of activity and the media campaigns will target Residents over the age of 18 and will be scheduled to promote awareness of the Program, while also taking into account the timing of relevant community events, such as Earth Day. This approach is shown to increase the scope and diversity of the audience reached while also improving message retention.

MED-Project will maintain a social media presence on major platforms featuring relevant information, Program news and developments, frequently asked questions, and video/audio content.

VI.A.2. Website for Residents and the Public [PHL § 291(2)(f), 10 NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(9)]

MED-Project will establish a Website that provides information intended to promote the use of the Program.

The Website will be:

- Mobile-responsive and accessible by common device and browser systems.
- Translated into multiple languages using a Google Translate-based product, including in the Specified Languages.³¹
- Maintained to keep information up-to-date and accurate.

Website content will provide:

- Information on collection options for Covered Drugs.
- A list of Collection Sites hosting collection receptacles, including a ZIP code-based map locator provided on a publicly available, third-party platform to help Residents find the nearest disposal locations.
- A mechanism to accept requests for Mail-Back Packages from Residents.
- Information to promote the Program, including instructions for safe handling and proper disposal of Covered Drugs.
- User-friendly access to public service announcements used in MED-Project's media campaigns.
- Links to MED-Project's social media webpages.

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³¹ MED-Project has identified ten languages as "Specified Languages" in alignment with New York State Executive Order 26.1 (Statewide Language Access Policy). The Website will communicate information in multiple formats, including:

- Video.
- Audio.
- Text.
- Explanatory graphics.
- Printable materials.

VI.A.3. Call Center [PHL § 291(2)(f). 10NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(9)]

MED-Project will establish a Call Center for Residents to order Mail-Back Packages, obtain information about Collection Site locations, and request educational materials about the Program. The Call Center will provide:

- An interactive voice response system in English and Spanish.
- Translators available to provide language options suited to local demographics.
- Teletype services for hearing- and speech-impaired individuals.
- Information on disposal options.
- A list of Collection Sites, including physical addresses, contact telephone numbers, and days and hours of operation.
- A mechanism to accept requests for Mail-Back Packages.
- Information to promote the Program, including instructions for safe handling and proper disposal of Covered Drugs.

<u>Appendix F</u> provides a Program implementation timeline beginning upon Plan approval with details about the timing of the launch of the Call Center. Appendix H provides the sample Call Center flow.

VI.A.4. Program Signage [PHL § 292(1)(b), 291(2)(f), 10 NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(9)]

PHL § 292(1)(b) requires that Pharmacies prominently display signage advertising drug collection to consumers. MED-Project will offer all Collection Sites and other locations signage upon request or through the Help Desk. This signage and printed materials will:

- Be translated into English and Spanish when provided as a printed hard copy.
- Be provided in a printable online version with translations available using a Google Translate based product on the Website, including in the Specified Languages.
- Use plain language and explanatory graphics to promote the availability of Collection Sites and Mail-Back Packages to Residents. PHL § 291.1(b).

MED-Project Kiosk signage will be designed with explanatory images that are readily understandable by Residents. Examples of MED-Project Kiosk signage are provided in <u>Appendix C</u>. Examples of in-store display signage are provided in <u>Appendix I</u>.

VI.A.5. Written Materials [PHL § 291(2)(f), 10 NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(9)]

MED-Project will provide educational and outreach materials to interested State and local agencies that interact with Residents and to other interested parties upon request. Educational and outreach materials will:

- Be translated into English and Spanish when provided as a printed hard copy.
- Be provided in a printable online version with translations available using a Google Translate based product on the Website, including in the Specified Languages.
- Advertise the availability of Collection Sites, the availability of Mail-Back Services, and options for the safe collection of Covered Drugs.

Appendix 1 provides sample images of MED-Project education and outreach materials.

- Engagement with the Call Center.

Media:

- Reach relative to Residents over the age of 18.
- Per-campaign impressions.
- Number of media placements.
- Complete list of placements by date and time.
- Number of visits to the Website.
- Number of calls to the Call Center.

Pharmacy Outreach:

- Number of participating locations.
- Amount of printable materials and signage distributed to participating locations.

MED-Project will solicit feedback from Residents over the age of 18 through two or more survey methods on channels that include:

- Website.
- Mobile applications.
- Digital media.
- Telephone.

MED-Project efforts to obtain Resident feedback will be designed to determine:

- The percentage of Residents over the age of 18 that are aware of the Program or exposed to the education and outreach program.
- The percentage of Residents over the age of 18 that have used the Program.
- The percentage of Residents over the age of 18 that believe the Program is accessible and easy to use.

MED-Project will use this feedback to improve Program effectiveness in the following areas:

- Outreach to Residents over the age of 18 through various communications channels or tools.
- Convenient resources for Residents over the age of 18 to find Covered Drug disposal options in their area.
- Information about Program collection services.

VI.A.7. Communication Coordination Efforts

If more than one drug take-back program is approved, MED-Project will coordinate with other Operators to enable Residents to identify, understand, and access the services provided by all approved drug take-back programs. MED-Project will notify the DOH of the terms of such coordination no later than 180 days after approval of multiple drug take-back program plans, unless the terms involve changes requiring approval from DOH as outlined in Appendix A, in which case MED-Project will seek such approval from DOH. The following sections describe the basic elements of coordination MED-Project proposes to pursue upon approval of multiple drug take-back programs.

VI.A.7.a. Secure Collection Receptacles

MED-Project will work with other Operators to develop a common drug take-back program mark that can be used on collection receptacles to identify approved drug take-back program services to Residents. MED-Project will provide the mark on MED-Project Kiosks. Collection receptacles may differ in color, shape, or size.

VI.A.7.b. Website

MED-Project proposes that all Operators use a neutrally branded drug take-back program website to serve as a combined website directory landing page for Residents to use to navigate to each Operator's website where information and services, such as drug take-back events and educational and outreach materials for Residents, will be available. The neutrally branded website directory landing page would provide a map displaying all Operators' collection sites and locations providing pre-addressed, pre-paid mailing envelopes to Residents, if applicable. The neutrally branded website and each Operator's website would display the common drug take-back program mark.

Each Operator, independent of the other Operator, would be expected to provide the Mail-Back Services, educational and outreach materials, and other services included in the Operator's approved plan.

MED-Project would direct Residents who initially visit the MED-Project Website to the neutrally branded website.

VI.A.7.c. Call Center

MED-Project proposes that all Operators use a neutrally branded, toll-free telephone number to serve as a combined call center directory to distribute calls from Residents to all approved drug take-back programs. Calls from Residents would be routed to an approved Operator's toll-free telephone number.

Pursuant to 10 NYCRR §60-4.3(b)(13), provide detailed information on the methods to be used for outreach and participation by pharmacies and other authorized collectors.

VI.B. Methods for Outreach and Participation by Pharmacies, Other Authorized Collectors, and Collection Sites [10 NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(13)]

MED-Project notified Pharmacies of the opportunity to serve as a Collection Site or Voucher Site to fulfill their obligation to provide for the safe collection of drugs under PHL § 292.1. Per PHL § 292.2, MED-Project also notified other potential Authorized Collectors in the State of the opportunity to serve as a Collection Site for the Program.

MED-Project will perform education and outreach to support Collection Sites and encourage participation from Pharmacies and other potential Authorized Collectors.

MED-Project notified Pharmacies, other potential Authorized Collectors, and Collection Sites about the opportunity to distribute printed materials about the Program.

VI.B.1. Website for Pharmacies, Other Potential Authorized Collectors, and Collection Sites [10 NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(13)]

MED-Project will establish a Website intended to educate Pharmacies, other potential Authorized Collectors, and Collection Sites about the Program and the opportunity to participate. The Website content is tailored to share relevant details and information that will be useful for the target audience to learn more about the Program and how they can participate.

VI.B.2. Video Series for Pharmacies, Other Potential Authorized Collectors, and Collection Sites [10 NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(13)]

MED-Project will produce educational videos for Pharmacies and other potential Authorized Collectors to simplify outreach and communications:

Program Overview

An overview of the requirements and opportunity to participate in the Program.

How to Participate

A detailed breakdown of what is involved in hosting a MED-Project Kiosk, including the Resident experience and the responsibilities of the site.

MED-Project will produce educational videos for Collection Sites to simplify outreach and communications:

Getting Started

A step-by-step walkthrough of the onboarding process.

Ongoing Support

Information on how to get support and continuing Program services.

VI.B.3. Direct Communication for Pharmacies, Other Potential Authorized Collectors, and Collection Sites [10 NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(13)]

MED-Project maintains an account management team for building and maintaining relationships with Collection Sites and Voucher Sites, both at a corporate and individual level. This team also manages inperson and virtual meetings and presentations with decision-makers at Pharmacies and other potential Authorized Collectors to encourage Program participation.

MED-Project will provide three types of support to Collection Sites and Voucher Sites:

Account Management Team

Manages communications at a corporate or brand level.

Operations Support Staff

Serve as the direct points-of-contact at the local level. Assist with outreach, onboarding, orientation, and education. Support Collection Sites and Voucher Sites. Monitor service schedule or replenishment inner liner and box usage to help maintain a sufficient stock of boxes and inner liners for MED-Project Kiosks.

– Help Desk:

Features online and phone support along with full access to multimedia guidance materials.

VI.B.4. Outreach [10 NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(13)]

MED-Project will promote Program outreach and awareness to Pharmacies, other potential Authorized Collectors, and Collection Sites through methods that include:

Educational materials distribution

MED-Project will distribute printed materials to create awareness and encourage participation of Pharmacies and other potential Authorized Collectors and provide updates or communicate changes to Collection Sites and Voucher Sites.

Press/Media Relations

MED-Project will distribute press releases and alerts to relevant publications in the State.

Printed Materials

MED-Project will provide the written materials described in section VI.A.5 for distribution.

VI.B.5. Traditional and Social Media [10 NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(13)]

MED-Project will distribute press releases directly to major media outlets and local media and provide templates for press releases and emails to partners and local health officials to spread throughout their own networks, allowing for customized news and announcements with specific details about their jurisdiction, organization, agency, or business.

MED-Project will also use its social media platforms to supplement outreach activity and perform efforts to assist in the distribution of information that builds awareness.

VII. FUNDING

This section must detail how the costs of pharmacy collection and other authorized collectors will be reimbursed, which costs shall include those retroactive to the effective date of Article 2-B, and where more than one manufacturer will be involved in the planned drug take back program, a plan for the fair and reasonable manner of allocated costs among the participants in such program such that the costs paid by each manufacturer is reasonably related to the volume or value of covered drugs sold in New York State. VII.A. Funding [PHL §§ 291(2)(g), 291(4), 292(3), 10 NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(11)]

MED-Project will pay all administrative and operational fees associated with the Program, including the cost of collecting, transporting and disposing of Covered Drugs collected from Collection Sites and the disposal of packaging collected with the Covered Drugs. As described above, MED-Project will either coordinate and pay for the collection, transport, and disposal of Covered Drugs collected at a MED-Project Kiosk, or MED-Project will reimburse the collection, transport, and disposal costs incurred by a MED-Project Reimbursed Kiosk. The costs paid or reimbursed by MED-Project will include the costs of installation and maintenance of collection receptacles, the inner liners and boxes provided to Collection Sites, Vouchers provided to Voucher Sites, pre-paid and pre-addressed Mail-Back Packages, transportation and disposal of collected Covered Drugs under the Program, communications, and public outreach and education efforts.

Program costs will be fairly and reasonably apportioned among all MED-Project participating Manufacturers using a confidential and proprietary cost allocation model adopted by the participating Manufacturers. This confidential and proprietary cost allocation model apportions all Program costs to all participating Manufacturers based both on the volume of Covered Drugs that a Manufacturer sells, and the value of those sales in terms of revenue. Both the volume of sales and the revenue associated with such sales are determined to the extent possible from third party vendor data sets. For a limited set of Covered Drugs not covered by these data, volume and revenue are determined through participating Manufacturer self-reporting. For both volume and revenue, MED-Project participating Manufacturers are placed into graduated tiers assigning Manufacturers a portion of Program costs. The cost allocation model described above is structured so that Covered Drug volumes and revenues for all participating Manufacturers are reasonably related to participating Manufacturer New York State funding obligations, as required by PHL § 291(2)(G).

VII.B. Costs Incurred by the State [PHL § 291(4)]

MED-Project acknowledges that Manufacturers must "pay costs incurred by the state in the administration and enforcement of the drug take back program." PHL § 291(4). MED-Project will pay the actual and reasonable costs incurred by the State in the administration and enforcement of the Program after receiving further instruction from DOH.

Note: A manufacturer, individually or jointly, will be responsible for payment of all administrative and operational fees associated with the drug take back program, including the cost of collecting, transporting, disposing of covered drugs and the cost of recycling and/or disposing of the packing collected with the covered drug.

MED-Project has policies and procedures in place to properly maintain its internal records, including the records required to meet its reporting obligations and to manage its Program. MED-Project's record maintenance system:

- Maintains records electronically on cloud-based business collaboration, document management, and customer relationship management platforms.
- Secures data through user and group level security policies.
- Is backed up on a predetermined schedule.

MED-Project will maintain records of Program details that include participating Manufacturers, Collection Sites, and functions performed in accordance with the Program, including but not limited to:

- The name of the Manufacturer, name of the Manufacturer's parent company and any subsidiaries, mailing address, FDA labeler code, and DEA number, as applicable, for each Manufacturer participating in the Program and the date enrolled.
- The name, address, phone, e-mail address, DEA number, and Bureau of Narcotic Enforcement license number, for any entity that will reverse distribute Covered Drugs for the Program.
- The name and address of each location in which a collection receptacle is installed and the date
 of its installation, as well as the dates of its discontinuance, removal, or relocation.
- The name and address of each Mail-Back Distribution Location and the date initiated.
- The location and date of each Drug Take-Back Event conducted.
- The total weight of Covered Drugs collected by each collection method annually.

MED-Project also requires that its Vendors and Collection Sites maintain certain records, including those required by applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements. MED-Project requires its Vendors involved with collection and disposal services to track information required for the annual report and to report that information to MED-Project at regular periods and upon request.

Program records required by the Regulations will be maintained for a period of five years.

VIII.C. Reporting [PHL §§ 291(2)(h), 291(7), 10 NYCRR 60-4.3(b)(14), 60-4.3(f) - 60-4.3(f)(11)]

Per PHL § 291.7, MED-Project will submit a report to DOH on or before August 1 in a manner set by DOH. Per 10 NYCRR 60-4.3(f), the information reported will describe the Program's activities for the prior calendar year, including, but not limited to:

- Manufacturers that participated during the reporting period, including all information required under 10 NYCRR 60-4.3(f)(1).
- Entities that reverse distributed Covered Drugs for the Program, including all information required under 10 NYCRR 60-4.3(f)(2).
- Pharmacies and other Authorized Collectors that maintained collection receptacles across the state during the reporting period, including all information required under 10 NYCRR 60-4.3(f)(3).
- Pharmacies and other Authorized Collectors that provided Mail-Back Packages or Vouchers during the reporting period, including all information required under 10 NYCRR 60-4.3(f)(4). MED-Project will report the number of physical Vouchers provided to Voucher Sites and a list of Voucher Sites receiving digital assets from MED-Project to print Vouchers.
- Drug Take-Back Events held during the reporting period, including all information required under 10 NYCRR 60-4.3(f)(5).
- The total weight of Covered Drugs collected by method of collection, including all information required under 10 NYCRR 60-4.3(f)(6). For Collection Sites, MED-Project will report the total weight of Covered Drugs collected in MED-Project Kiosks.
- A description of collection activities, including policies and procedures for methods of collection.
- A description of outreach and public education activities, including marketing materials, public service messages, and website information.
- An evaluation of the program and of each collection method, including an evaluation of education and outreach, an evaluation of Program costs and of costs involved for each method, and suggestions for overall Program improvement.
- A list of Manufacturers and Authorized Collectors that have discontinued participation.

Because of diversion concerns associated with identifying amounts of Covered Drugs collected in MED-Project Kiosks at individual Collection Sites, MED-Project will provide to DOH in the annual report the total amount of drugs collected at each Collection Site on a list that uses a unique site ID for each Collection Site. MED-Project will provide DOH with a confidential site identification list that can be used to match each unique site ID to a Collection Site participating in the Program.

For proposals representing participation by more than one manufacturer:

Appendix A: Change Management

MED-Project will submit changes to DOH in a manner set by DOH.

MED-Project will comply with the applicable regulatory requirements that address changes to the Program. In particular, MED-Project will:

- Provide a report to DOH within 30 days of the discontinuance of participation in the Program by any participating Manufacturer or Collection Site, pursuant to 10 NYCRR 60-4.3(e).
- Provide written notice to DOH of a closure, relocation, or discontinuance of a Collection Site that affects MED-Project's achievement of Reasonable Access requirements. Such notice shall be provided pursuant to 10 NYCRR 60-4.2(c)(1).
- Provide written notice to DOH within 15 days of the addition of a new Collection Site to replace a
 discontinued Collection Site reported pursuant to 10 NYCRR 60-4.2(c)(1). Such notice shall be
 provided pursuant to 10 NYCRR 60-4.2(c)(3).

For substantive modifications to the Program that are not explicitly addressed in the Regulations, MED-Project will submit those substantive changes in writing for approval by DOH before implementing the modification to the Program. Modifications subject to DOH approval under PHL § 291(6) and 10 NYCRR 60-4.3(a) will include:

- Changes to the scope of Covered Drugs collected.
- Changes in categories of collection services offered (e.g., collection receptacles, Mail-Back Services).
- Changes to the reimbursement available and the general process for requesting reimbursement.

In the case of an emergency or unavoidable circumstance, some of the above modifications may be implemented before notification. In such cases, MED-Project will provide notice to DOH as soon as practicable, but no later than 15 days after MED-Project learns of the modification.

MED-Project will not submit changes and minor modifications that do not significantly alter Program operations to DOH for approval. Examples of such changes and minor modifications include non-substantive changes to the education and outreach materials.






